Through these efforts, we aim to support a deep educational shift - transforming climate education from a theoretical add-on into the very foundation of training a modern, conscious, and empowered workforce.

This conference is specifically targeted at the **academic community** actively interested in raising the quality of higher education and advancing climate education. This target audience is chosen with intent - it is educators and curriculum designers who serve as the "architects of change," uniquely positioned to bridge the theory-practice divide and close the Climate Action Gap.

We want participants to leave the University of Economics in Katowice equipped with the experiences and inspiration needed to:

- **Design future-proof competencies:** How can we best equip students with green skills and the readiness to drive climate action?
- **Bridge the gap between science and teaching practice:** How can we integrate climate-related topics into the syllabi of various disciplines to make them engaging and intellectually stimulating for today's students?
- **Develop transversal skills:** How can we use climate education as a launchpad for cultivating students' critical thinking and complex problem-solving abilities?

- **Connect:** We are building a collaborative network of curriculum designers and educators to scale our impact. An inspired teacher becomes a local leader of change, bringing the mission of climate neutrality to hundreds of students.
